This is a reminder of some of our policies that parents often have questions about: Parents, it is critical that you understand and acknowledge that students can **ONLY** be released to adults who are listed on the child's "Emergency Card." - The first day of school classroom assignments are considered to be firm. Remember, placement was carefully selected for your child by the principal and the grade level team of teachers. Students' attitudes toward their teachers and school are highly influenced by the attitudes of their parents. We can all provide your children and our students with a successful beginning of the school year by responding to their classroom assignments with positive enthusiasm.
- Kinder through Third grade, class size limit is 24. Students might have to be transferred to another class if we exceed that number. We will do everything possible to make this transition for the student as smooth as possible.

This school year Vicki Swertfager is the MVP President; she will be encouraging your participation as an MVP member. New Roof at Mar Vista

By now you have noticed a beautiful new roof at Mar Vista. This is the first time the roof has been replaced since 1965, when Mar Vista was originally built. This project was paid for by Measure L funds. More projects are planned for next summer.

Parking and Traffic In and Out of School

We cannot stress it enough, plan to have your child(ren) to school by 7:50am every day. This will ensure that they will be in class on time and help prevent you from being stuck in the morning traffic. Also please remember never to leave your vehicle unattended in the drop off/pick up area at any time. Always pull your vehicle forward when in the drop off/pick up zone. If you wish to walk your child(ren) to class, please park your vehicle in one of the designated parking areas. It is ok to park in the short term parking and buses area- double parking is permitted in this area while you walk your child(ren) into the school. Do not double park behind handicap parking at the end as this will block the flow of traffic.

When picking up in the afternoon, stay left in the express pickup lane when entering the school. The right hand side is for the buses and parking only. Also, when pulling into the school, it is imperative that we do not block access for the buses. Unfortunately, our parking lot was not the best design. We need to be patient with each other and plan accordingly. Let's be good role models for our children. We are all in this together.





Tips for a Successful School Year

How you start the school year can determine how well the rest of the year will go. Here is how to make sure your child gets off to a great start this year:

- Review school safety. Talk to your child about the importance of following school rules. The Code of Conduct at Mar Vista School is **Be Safe**, **Be Respectful**, and **Be Responsible**.
- Get to know your child's teacher. When parents and teachers are on the same team, kids do better in school. Once you've met face to face, you'll find it easier to ask questions or share a concern about your child.
- Set goals. Students who do best in school have both short and long term goals. In order to succeed, your child needs goals to keep them on the right track.
- Settle into a routine. Kids thrive on predictability. Have a regular time for homework. Set and stick to a regular bedtime. Plan a morning routine that gets everyone out the door on time.
- Don't over schedule your child. Give them time to unwind after school.
- Be interested in your child's schoolwork. Ask them about school every day.
