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Parking and Traffic In and Out of School

We cannot stress it enough, plan to have your child(ren) to school by 7:50am every day. This will ensure that they will be in class on time and help prevent you from being stuck in the morning traffic. Also please remember never to leave your vehicle unattended in the drop off/pick up area at any time. Always pull your vehicle forward when in the drop off/pick up zone. If you wish to walk your child(ren) to class, please park your vehicle in one of the designated parking areas. It is ok to park in the short term parking and buses area- double parking is permitted in this area and to walk with your child(ren) into the school. Do not double park behind handicap parking at the end- this will block the flow of traffic.

When picking up in the afternoon, stay left in the express pick-up lane when entering the school. The right hand side is for the buses and parking only. Also when pulling into the school, it is imperative that we do not block access for the buses. Unfortunately, our parking lot was not the best design. We need to be patient with each other and plan accordingly. Let's be good role models for our children. We are all in this together.
